An Employer’s Perspective:

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, “employment of registered nurses is projected to grow 19 percent from 2012 to 2022, faster than the average for all occupations. Growth will occur for a number of reasons, including an increased emphasis on preventative care; healthcare reform; growing rates of chronic conditions, such as diabetes and obesity; and demand for health services from the baby boomer population, as they live longer and more active lives. “Nurses need the skills to be able to draw out information from patients, critical thinking skills, and patience and compassion to be competitive in the workforce. It is also important that they engage in lifelong learning as the industry continues to change.”

Salaries:

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the national median pay for Registered Nurses is \$61,470; however, salaries depend upon the industry, level of position, and geographical region.
